WRITE OFF VEHICLE ASSESSMENT 2017

Written-off vehicle legislation has been designed to improve road safety, provide consumer protection and clamp down on vehicle related crime. With the significant changes in modern vehicle construction methods, materials and technology currently being used, a criteria that filled the existing gaps of previous legislation has been introduced. This course provides loss assessors and estimators with the correct knowledge in understanding the new criteria for determining if the vehicle qualifies as a statutory write-off when inspecting damaged modern vehicles.

Course Content

Module 1—Modern Vehicle Materials

This module introduces the student to new legislation changes and provides an overview of new vehicle construction and materials used. The module continues with identifying the new construction types and parts of today's vehicles. The student will also discover why the restoration of vehicle components and measurements is so vitally important in the correct repair of modern vehicles.

Module 2—Modern Vehicle Engineering

This module continues by explaining to the student the functions of new unitised structures and identifying new materials. The student will be introduced to the properties of new steel types and materials and their significance in collision energy management. The module also provides information on SRS systems and the various joining technologies used for the advanced materials often found in vehicles today

Recommendations

This class covers the considerations for loss assessors to determine whether a vehicle will constitute as a write off as required by the legislation introduced in NSW. It is recommended that students have an understanding of HSS and collision repair processes. Courses that would be helpful include:

- Steel Unitised Structure and Technologies (SPS07)
- Best Practices for High Strength Steel (SPS09)
- Damage Analysis of Advanced Materials (DAM08)
